In 2010, The Cleveland Police Foundation became the reality of police officials and civic visionaries after they identified a need to support the Division of Police for the City of Cleveland and the numerous activities they conduct on behalf of the community. #### CLEVELAND POLICE HISTORICAL SOCIETY & MUSEUM



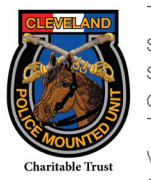

Sadly, in its short history their members have rendered final honors to more than 75 law enforcement officers who have died in the line of duty, and over 25 military personnel who made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our country.
