

Homeless Survival Kit Fundraiser Conclusion



This summer I set out to run a 1/2 marathon to fundraise and build homeless survival kits. I partnered with the Cleveland Police Foundation for this project. Our vision was to create "survival kit" backpacks for officers to hand out as they see fit while on duty. This project would not only help provide relief to homeless individuals but also create positive interactions between officers and their community - a win win! Thanks to your generosity, the project turned out to be a tremendous success! With the support from over 60 donors, we created 500 survival kits and purchased bonus homeless winter items. The 5 Cleveland police districts received 100 bags each this past week and have begun distribution.
